A Study of Psalm 119 ~ Verses 41 - 56

(41 – 42) How does God's word (or promise) convey His message of salvation? How does this serve as an answer to the reproach (or taunting) that we encounter? (1 Peter 3: 13 - 17)

(43 – 44) How does God's word provide hope, and what is the outcome of the hope that it gives? (*Ephesians 1: 17 - 18*)

(45 – 46) In verse 45, what does it mean that we would "walk in liberty / freedom"? What leads to that liberty, and what should be our perspective in sharing God's word with those around us? (*Romans 1:* 16 - 17)

(47 - 48) What attitude should we have toward God's commandments, and what action should we take as a result? (*Matthew 11: 28 - 30*)

(49 – 50) What request does the author make to the Lord in verse 49? As recorded in verse 50, how does God's word "give us life / revive us"?

(51 – 52) What statement does the psalmist make regarding the benefit of God's word? How can reflecting on God's word help us to overcome adversity? (*Romans 15: 4; Hebrews 12: 1*)

(53 – 54) How can knowledge of God's word help us to withstand persecution and the feeling of isolation that we sometimes encounter from being surrounded by temptation and sin?

(55 – 56) Describe the meaning of the author's statement in verse 55 (that he remembered God's name "in the night"). What does the psalmist state that he had taken possession of in verse 56? (*Ephesians 5: 8; Colossians 1: 13*)
