

A Study of Psalm 119 ~ Verses 57 - 72

(57 – 58) What does the author mean in stating that the Lord is his “portion”? What does the psalmist’s statement in **verse 58** teach us about prayer and obedience? (*John 15: 7*)

(59 – 60) What do we learn in this passage about the importance of self-awareness? What is the intended outcome of the self-reflection that the author references? (*2 Corinthians 13: 5*)

(61 – 62) What situation does the psalmist articulate, and how does he respond to that situation? In **verse 62**, what does he state regarding our attitude and response to the blessings that God has provided?

(63 – 64) What does the author say about our relationship with fellow faithful believers, and what is it that binds us together? What point does he make in **verse 64** regarding God’s mercy?

(65 – 66) What statement does the author make about the blessings that God had given him? In **verse 66**, what request does the author make to the Lord, and what connection does he make between belief and understanding? (*Acts 17: 10 – 12*)

(67 – 68) What point does the author make about the value of affliction? How can challenges and hardships strengthen our faith and obedience to God’s word? (*Romans 5: 3 – 5*)

(69 – 70) What statement does the author make regarding those who persecute us? What distinguishes us from them, and what hope does this realization give us? (*Romans 12: 14*)

(71 – 72) What point does the author reiterate about the value of hardship? How can knowledge of God’s word help us to overcome challenging situations? (*James 1: 2 – 5*)
