

The Letter to the Galatians: Chapter 6

August 11 – 14, 2024

(1) What direction did Paul provide regarding our willingness and ability to help our brethren overcome sin? According to Paul, what attitude should we have and display while providing such assistance, and what subsequent warning did he provide?

(James 5: 19 – 20)

(2 – 5) Describe Pauls' point from this passage. What attitude should we have toward others in relation to our opinion of ourselves? What is the outcome of the self – examination to which Paul refers?

(Matthew 7: 1 – 5; Philippians 2: 3 – 4)

(6 – 8) What direction did Paul provide in verse 6 regarding our relationship with those who teach God's word? From verses 7 & 8, describe the point of Paul's illustration regarding sowing and reaping. What is it that we "sow", and as a result, what do we "reap"?

(1 Corinthians 9: 7 – 14; 2 Corinthians 9: 6 – 8)

(9 – 10) What encouragement did Paul give regarding our stamina in doing good works? What is the outcome of our efforts to serve others, and who should we direct those efforts toward?

(Luke 6: 37 – 38; John 13: 12 – 17)

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(11) What might Paul's comment indicate about his health challenge that he mentioned previously in his letter? For what other reason might Paul have used "large letters"? (*Galatians 4: 13 – 15*)

(12 – 13) What final criticism did Paul direct at the Judaizing teachers? As indicated by Paul, what was the motivation of those false teachers, and what did they intend to gain? How can we apply his comments about false teachers as we strive to uphold the truth of God's word? (*2 Peter 2: 1 – 3*)

(14 – 15) How did Paul describe his relationship with Christ? What perspective did Paul share regarding the outcome of that relationship, and what can we apply from his observations? (*Philippians 3: 7 – 11*)

(16 – 18) What did Paul desire for his audience, and what is the "Israel of God" to which he referred? What evidence did Paul provide to point out the focus and outcome of his service to the Lord? (*2 Corinthians 11: 23 – 25*)
