

A Study of the Letter to the Hebrews: Chapter 13

- In verses 1 – 6, consider those actions that the writer directs in response to the sacrifice that Jesus made. How is our relationship with God articulated in verses 5 – 6?
- From verses 7 – 9, what additional directives are provided? How is Jesus described in verse 8?
- In verses 10 – 16, what is represented by the altar referenced in verse 10? Explain the reference to Christ suffering “outside the gate / camp”. Accordingly, what response does the writer direct from us?
- What direction does the writer provide in verse 17? What request does he make in verses 18 – 19?
- From verses 20 – 21, what is the writer’s desire for his audience? How does the writer describe Jesus?
- What exhortation and comments does the writer provide in his closing remarks from verses 22 – 25?
